Applications are invited from Canadian Teacher Leaders interested in working as a teacher leader for the beginning of implementation of Reading Recovery in the Cayman Islands. This is a contract position and salary has been set on a per diem basis. Travel costs, accommodations, and in-country transport will be covered by the Ministry of Education of the Cayman Islands. This person will be expected to train teachers to become Reading Recovery teachers and to provide support to establish the implementation. The individual selected for this position will be required to make a two to three year commitment to this implementation, and be willing to travel to the Cayman Islands multiple times throughout the school year.

The Cayman Islands is a small education system organized in a manner similar to the United Kingdom. Eleven government schools will be involved in Reading Recovery at the present time.
